AGTECH CONNECT: ADVANCING INNOVATION IN AGRICULTURE

The first AgTech Connect event of the year, hosted at the USDA's National Center for Agricultural Utilization Research (NCAUR), brought together innovators, researchers, and industry leaders to explore advancements in agriculture, sustainability, and bioprocessing. The event opened with Steven Cermak, Research Leader of the Bio-Oils Research Unit at USDA-ARS, who provided an insightful overview of NCAUR's groundbreaking work. Bryan Moser, a USDA-ARS Organic Chemistry Researcher, followed with a presentation on developing biobased alternatives to PFAS, a critical step toward more sustainable industrial chemistry. Additional highlights included Todd Main of the Illinois Soy Innovation Center, introducing a new initiative to expand soybased product innovation; Aaron Armstutz of Natural Fiber Welding (NFW), sharing breakthroughs in biomaterial processing; and Tyler Strom of the Illinois Agri-Food Alliance, emphasizing the agri-food sector's statewide economic impact—supporting 900,000 jobs and representing 15% of Illinois's workforce.

CAREER SPARK RECOGNIZED AS A STATEWIDE BEST PRACTICE


