Business Attraction

Epic Medical Chooses Pekin to Build Medical Equipment

A major business attraction success headlined the year as Epic Medical, a Singapore-based medical device innovator, announced plans to establish its first North American manufacturing center in Pekin. The \$25 million investment is expected to create approximately 100 new jobs and expand domestic production capacity for critical medical supplies, strengthening supply chains while creating new opportunities for regional workers.

Damera Group Selects Greater Peoria for First U.S. Manufacturing Operation

Greater Peoria secured another significant win as Damera Corporation, a Canadian manufacturer of the all-electric eJest public transit bus, selected the region for its first U.S. manufacturing facility. The company plans to invest more than \$30 million and create at least 90 new jobs. This decision reinforces Greater Peoria's growing reputation as a hub for clean energy and advanced manufacturing—and shows how strategic relationship-building can turn a single connection into a major project announcement.



Celebrating Green Innovation: Viridis Comes to Peoria

Viridis Chemical officially opened its new facility in Peoria, representing a \$24 million investment and advancing Greater Peoria's momentum in the bioeconomy. The company converts ethanol sourced from neighboring BioUrja into ethyl acetate, a high-demand solvent used in products ranging from paints to pharmaceuticals. Once fully operational, the plant is expected to employ 25 people—another milestone in the region's commitment to sustainable industry and economic diversification.

Expanding Global Networks in Brazil

Greater Peoria continued building international relationships that support long-term growth and innovation. A regional delegation participated in the Americas Competitiveness Exchange (ACE) in Belém, convening ecosystem builders from 15 countries, and then attended the ACATE StartUp Summit in Florianópolis—Brazil's premier startup conference with more than 10,000 participants. These exchanges continue positioning Greater Peoria as a gateway for international collaboration, knowledge sharing, and future investment.



Quick Hits

- Received and analyzed 40 site selector inquiries from Illinois EDC.
- Submitted properties for 16 of those inquiries, resulting in three site visits to date.
- Built and launched a digital marketing campaign to highlight industrial properties in Tazewell County.
- Hosted a two-day visit from the Quebec Government Office in Chicago to explore advanced manufacturing alignment and partnership opportunities.
- Attended the Select USA conference in DC to connect with foreign companies looking to expand to the US.
- Joined the Illinois delegation in Mexico City to build relationships with Mexican business and economic institutions.

Business Assistance



Foreign-Trade Zone #114

GPEDC administers Foreign-Trade Zone (FTZ) #114, a powerful tool that helps regional companies compete globally by reducing duties, lowering costs, and improving supply chain efficiency. Serving a 24-county region—and celebrating its 40th anniversary—FTZ #114 remains a meaningful advantage for manufacturers and logistics operations across Central Illinois.

To make FTZ benefits easier to understand, GPEDC finalized a refreshed FTZ marketing one-pager and completed an animated explainer video in partnership with McDaniels Marketing. These tools translate a complex program into clear, accessible information for companies and site selectors.



Crane Equipment & Service Expands Into Morton

Crane Equipment & Service (CES), an Eureka-based designer, builder, and installer of crane lifting solutions, is expanding its regional footprint with a second facility in Morton. CES is investing \$4.5 million in the project, supported by a \$600,000 state economic development grant, enabling the company to grow capacity, serve new customers, and add new jobs. GPEDC supported the effort by helping secure final approval of the Illinois Community Development Block Grant, awarded to the Village of Morton on behalf of CES, an example of how strategic public funding can accelerate private investment and business growth in Greater Peoria.

Illinois River Partnership Summit Strengthens a Regional Economic Asset




GPEDC supported the inaugural Illinois River Partnership Summit in Peoria—three days of programming focused on economic development, environmental sustainability, and transportation along the Illinois River. Each day of the Summit focused on a different initiative: the Illinois Waterway Port Commission and inaugural meetings for the Illinois River Cities and Towns Initiative and the Green Marine Highway Initiative. The event brought together over 100 attendees representing riverfront leadership and port district stakeholders, strengthening relationships around one of the region's most important infrastructure assets and reinforcing shared priorities that support business growth and regional competitiveness.

Business Assistance



GPMN Quarterly Meeting: Learning From Your Peers

The Greater Peoria Manufacturing Network's quarterly meeting highlighted one of the Network's biggest strengths: manufacturers learning directly from one another. Organized by Dick Peplow and dubbed "Learning from Your Peers," the session featured member-led spotlights on real-world strategies that strengthen competitiveness, quality systems, customer development, workforce culture, and supply chain performance. Quality Metal Products shared practices that helped earn recognition as one of Caterpillar's top 25 suppliers. Philippi-Hagenbuch discussed using trade shows and professional associations to build new business. Morton Industries presented on building an employee culture grounded in communication and appreciation. TADA highlighted how technology and software can help manufacturers manage supply chain disruptions. The meeting reinforced the value of the Network as a practical forum where insights translate into stronger operations and better outcomes.

- Facilitated an industry tour at Alto Ingredients (Pekin) to highlight the region's strength in bioprocessing and specialty ingredient manufacturing.
- Coordinated a National League of Cities session with 17 local leaders, advancing tools for housing and downtown/retail redevelopment.
- Chip's Tool & Machine joined the GP Manufacturing Network.

Workforce Solutions



Career Spark: 9 Years of Impact and Growing

Career Spark returned to the Peoria Civic Center for its 9th year, hosting approximately 4,000 eighth-grade students from 62 schools across the region. Over two days, students rotated through hands-on career experiences across diverse sectors, giving them real, memorable exposure to career pathways right here in Central Illinois. With more than 700 volunteers powering the event, Career Spark is truly a community-wide workforce effort.

This year's standout additions included a flight simulator and baggage-handling exhibit from Peoria International Airport, giving students firsthand insight into aviation careers. From medical simulations and robot dogs to utility line maintenance practice and CPR training, Career Spark continued to show students that "future career" can feel real right now.



Career Spark Recognized as a Statewide Best Practice

Career Spark was named a best practice by Education Systems (EdSystems) at Northern Illinois University, reinforcing its value as a leading workforce development model in Illinois. The recognition validates what Greater Peoria has built through strong employer engagement, hands-on learning, and sustained partnership.

Career Summit Explores Career Opportunities for Youth with Disabilities

GPEDC, along with several other local nonprofit organizations, hosted the annual Career Summit Expo for more than 200 students with disabilities from across the Greater Peoria Area. For the first time, Career Summit offered hands-on demonstrations that let students explore different career pathways. Some popular examples included Emergency Rescue, Welding Simulation, Dog Grooming, and Hairstylist/Beautician. In total, the summit had 28 schools in attendance, over 30 employers at the job fair, and over 20 employers across the Greater Peoria Area who provided hands-on demonstrations for students.

- CareerSpark You're Hired received updates to video content, vendor booths, and its overall visual appearance. 1,206 students participated in Fall 2024/Spring 2025 CareerSpark You're Hired.
- Supported the DIGIM College Fair at the University of Illinois Chicago, coordinating planning and day-of logistics and facilitating student-facing career sessions for 600+ high school students from Central Illinois.
- Hosted workshop with Jobs for the Future to explore work-based learning and apprenticeship programs for casting, forging and foundry companies.

Rural Development & Outreach

AgTech Connect Strengthens the Region's Rural Innovation Economy

AgTech Connect continued to grow as a platform connecting educators, entrepreneurs, and industry leaders around agricultural innovation—one of Greater Peoria's most important rural economic engines. Events hosted at the USDA's National Center for Agricultural Utilization Research and Beck's Hybrids showcased how research, seed innovation, and data-driven tools are shaping the future of farming and bioprocessing. AgTech Connect also expanded into educator-focused programming, introducing agriculture teachers from 14 school districts to tools and strategies for teaching entrepreneurship and business development. The ripple effect reaches classrooms across Central Illinois and helps prepare students for careers in the modern ag economy.



Federal Partnership Grows with USDA Rural Development

GPEDC advanced federal relationships through a meeting with Jesus Ortega, Illinois State Director for USDA Rural Development. The conversation focused on aligning USDA's suite of housing, infrastructure, and business development programs with the needs of Greater Peoria's rural communities. Priority topics included broadband expansion, access to capital for small businesses, and affordable housing—core building blocks for rural prosperity and quality of life.

Thousands to Be Connected to High Speed Internet

Over the past few years and in partnership with our county governments and the Just Transition Fund, GPEDC has been working to expand access to high speed internet in our rural communities. The hard work of planning and feasibility studies has paid off. In late 2025 the Illinois Office of Broadband announced provisional grants to internet service providers via the federal BEAD program that will extend broadband access to 10,036 unserved locations.

- Helped develop economic strategies in Comprehensive Plans for Creve Coeur, Bartonville and Chillicothe.

- Supported local governments in applying for Energy Transition Communities funding.
- Organized and hosted three workshops for public officials on addressing aging infrastructure and rising energy costs.
- Completed a study on the economic impact of Renewable Energy in the region.
- Co-organized the Illinois Soybean Association's Springboard Challenge conference in Peoria.
- Secured a \$2,500 grant from Compeer Financial's Fund for Rural America to strengthen the AgTech Connect programming partnership.
- Kathie Brown was celebrated as "Small Business Advocate of the Year" by Bradley's SBDC for supporting rural entrepreneurship.

Communications & Marketing

Industry Profile Launch: Peoria is Plant-Based

GPEDC released a new industry profile—Peoria is Plant-Based—to support site selectors and business leaders exploring bioprocessing, precision fermentation, and bio-renewable product development. The profile captures the region's competitive strengths in a clear, usable format designed to convert interest into investment.

Making Regional Impact Easier to See

GPEDC developed a new “Recent Wins” flyer and a companion webpage highlighting major investments across the region over the past two years, including new businesses and business expansions. These tools help the public, partners, and prospects quickly understand the measurable impact of regional economic development efforts.

Startup Showcase Celebrates Innovation During Economic Development Week

As part of Economic Development Week, GPEDC hosted a Startup Showcase at Distillery Labs to highlight regional innovation. Five early-stage companies—Bear’s Bites, HuMod, AgDefense Systems, dotbox, and enterN—delivered live pitches and shared lessons from building a business in Central Illinois. The event was livestreamed and received media coverage, amplifying regional visibility and reinforcing Greater Peoria’s growing identity as a place where entrepreneurs can launch and grow.



Quick Hits

- Generated 298,551 social media impressions, a 26.9% increase compared to 2024.
- Grew total followers across platforms to 10,005, a 12.6% year-over-year increase.
- Increased average engagement rate to 6.18% (up from 5.78% in 2024).
- Drove 9,119 link clicks from social posts, strengthening traffic from digital channels.
- Recorded ~16,000 website users, a 22.6% increase compared to 2024.



Economic Development Planning



Big Table Greater Peoria: Advancing Community-Driven Economic Development

In 2025, the Greater Peoria Economic Development Council advanced regional collaboration through an expanded Big Table Greater Peoria initiative designed to elevate community voices and inform long-term economic strategy. The flagship Big Table convened a broad cross-section of residents, business leaders, educators, students, and public officials for action-oriented conversations focused on opportunity, talent, entrepreneurship, and livability. The day included a well-received keynote from national innovation leader Victor W. Hwang. Building on this momentum, GPEDC extended the conversation through a Rural Big Table series across Woodford, Mason, and Tazewell Counties, with a final session planned in Logan County to ensure rural perspectives are fully represented. Insights gathered throughout the series will be synthesized into a comprehensive regional report and used to inform updates to the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS), aligning community priorities with future investment, policy, and partnership decisions across Greater Peoria.



GPEDC Secures EDA Grant to Fuel Regional Strategy

GPEDC was awarded a three-year Partnership Planning Grant from the U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA), securing core operational funding through 2027. This support is foundational to executing the region's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS), maintaining a project pipeline, and facilitating cross-sector initiatives that drive implementation. Over the past decade, GPEDC has helped attract nearly \$28 million in federal funding through its EDA partnership—supporting transformative infrastructure and innovation projects.

Elevating Partnerships at IEDC

GPEDC represented Greater Peoria at the International Economic Development Council's Annual Conference in Detroit, building national connections and strengthening partnership practice. Participation in the Economic Partnership Alliance training provided frameworks for collaboration with community-based partners—an important lever for inclusive economic growth and durable regional alignment. The visit also included a tour with Live6 Alliance, a Detroit nonprofit revitalizing neighborhood corridors through small business support and placemaking—bringing back ideas relevant to community-scale development in Greater Peoria.
