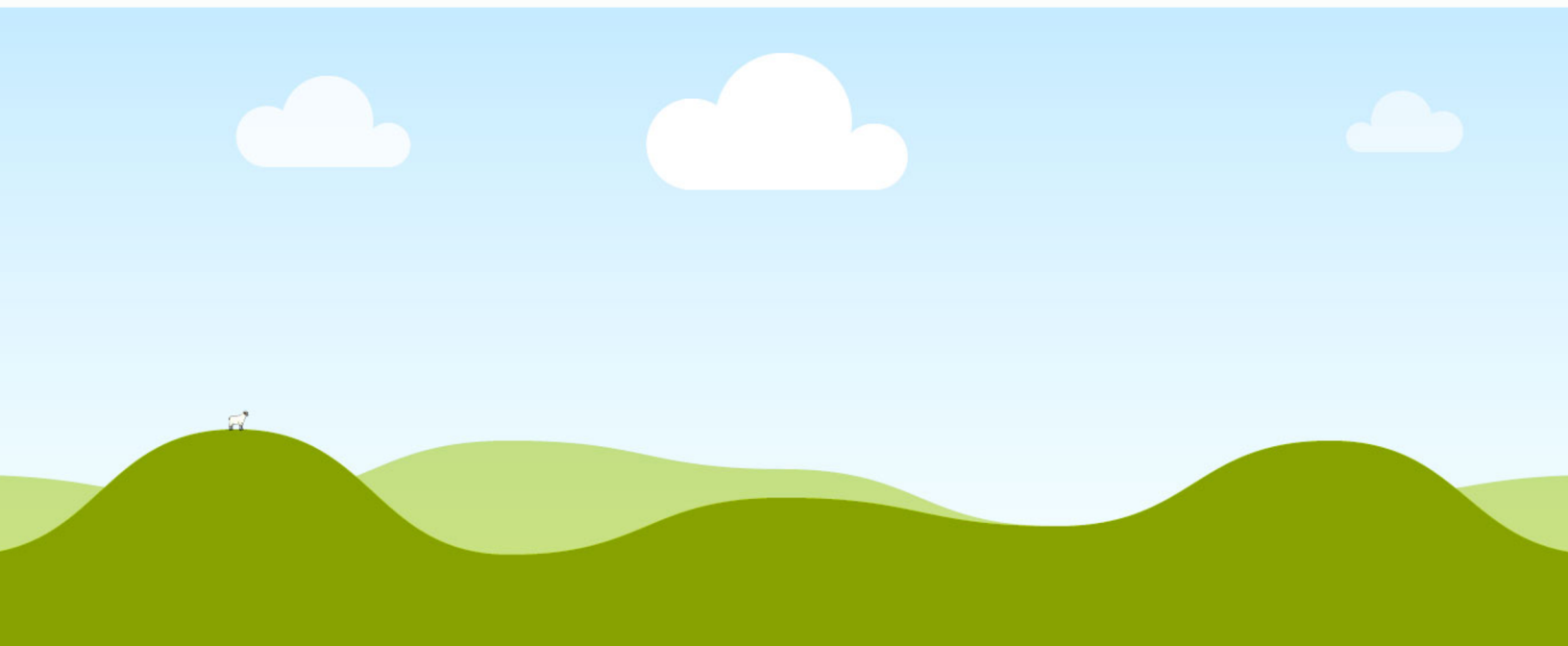

Bradley Reinvests in the Student Experience

Largest student housing investment in decades reshaping campus living.

Bradley University is investing \$25 million to completely transform Harper Hall, its signature residence hall on Main Street. The project replaces traditional dorm rooms with suite-style and single-room options, private in-suite bathrooms, study lounges, collaboration spaces and wellness rooms. Construction begins this fall with reopening set for fall 2028. The adjacent Wyckoff Hall will be removed to make way for green space, patio areas and a new entrance. The work is part of a broader campus transformation that also includes Williams Dining Hall, Olin Hall, Neumiller Hall and the Michel Student Center.

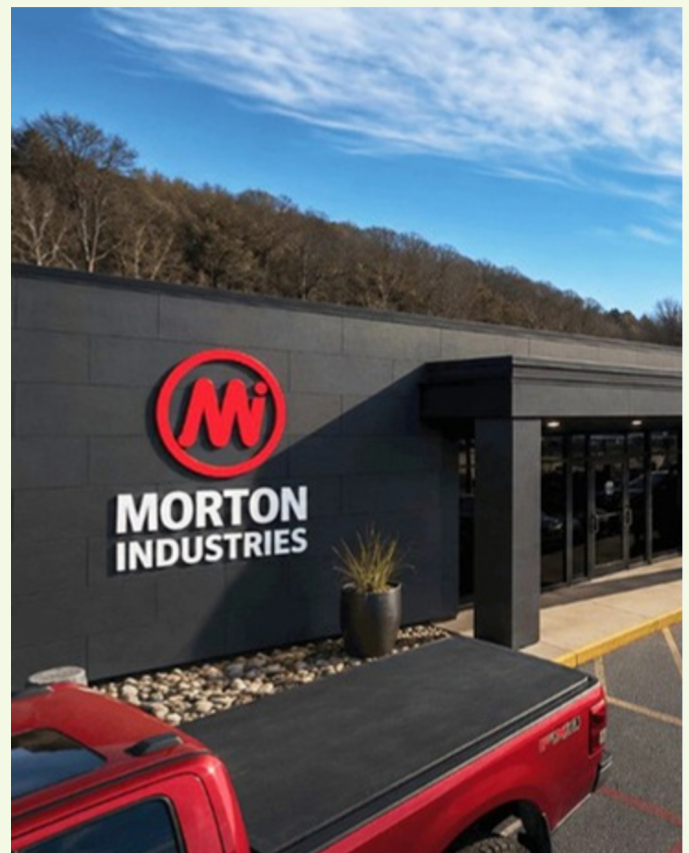

Homegrown Manufacturer Expands into East Peoria

80,000 square feet of stainless steel production serving the data center market.

Morton Industries, a precision metal fabricator operating in the region since 1946, acquired a manufacturing facility at 2500 N. Main Street in East Peoria, closing on the purchase in June 2026. The site will dedicate 80,000 square feet to stainless steel production, including tubing for data center cooling and hydraulic systems. The company plans to hire 50 to 100 employees at the East Peoria location as part of roughly 200 hires across its facilities this year.

PEORIA HEIGHTS • SEPT 2025

The Heights' Largest Employer Doubles Down

\$35 million private investment anchoring the Prospect corridor.

Pearl is leading a private investment of more than \$35 million in its main building at 1200 E. Glen Ave. and surrounding properties in Peoria Heights. Backed by a tax increment financing agreement with the Village, the phased project covers exterior and interior renovation of the former headquarters, followed by rehabilitation of nearby properties for ground-floor retail fronting Prospect with office space above. The expansion is expected to add up to 60 new employees. Pearl has operated in the Heights for 70 years across three generations and has long been the village's largest employer.

All-Electric Transit Vehicles Made in Greater Peoria

Electric minibus production creating 90 regional transit jobs.

Damera Corporation, a Canadian transportation dealer and manufacturer, is siting its first U.S. factory in the Greater Peoria region. The project represents at least \$31.5 million in investment and 90 jobs over the next four years to produce all-electric minibuses for the U.S. public transit market.

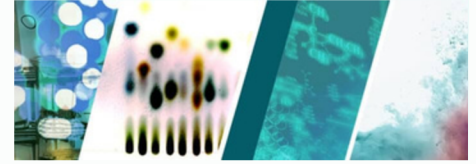
