Through hands-on exhibits, this event aims to spark students' interest in one or more of the 16 nationally recognized career pathways available in Greater Peoria. This event is a collaboration of 200+ regional employers to demonstrate career pathways and what work looks (and feels) like, introducing thousands of regional Jr. High students to potential pathways, helping them set a roadmap of what the next steps will be in high school and beyond to reach their career aspirations.

You're Hired is a virtual program offered to High School and College students with the simple mission of educating our region's students about the career opportunities readily available to them. This is brought to students via a virtual platform and offers employers enhanced capabilities to showcase careers, tours, interviews, and more - going beyond the standard offerings of a booth at a local career fair.

### **Regional Opportunities for Earning a Postsecondary Credential**

The new IT Workforce Accelerator is a collaboration of industry, education, community-based and other stakeholders developing an IT workforce ecosystem in Central Illinois to meet high-demand workforce needs. The pipeline includes equity-based pathways from high school through college credential completion by cultivating: awareness and interest in IT career pathways, essential ("soft") skills for workforce readiness, and IT skillsets through employer-driven IT credential programs.

### Illinois Central College Apprenticeship Programs

This program provides a roadmap for employers and students to develop apprenticeships for students and provides funding and tax incentives for employers who do hire student apprenticeships. In addition, many ICC Apprenticeship programs include wraparound services for students including stipends, transportation, childcare, and life coaching. Programs range from a few weeks to multi-year and provide job-ready credentials for careers in Manufacturing, Healthcare, Transportation, Energy, Technology, and Workforce Readiness.

### Illinois Central College Workforce Sustainability Center

The ICC Workforce Sustainability Center will help both first-time students and career changers. Having training and education programs - close to home - prepares potential job seekers with the skills they need to succeed. As more area workers develop skills to support the needs of the growing businesses, they will help communities attract raw investment and support a prosperous local economy.

### Workforce Equity Initiative

The Workforce Equity Initiative (WEI) is a statewide grant program focused on expanding training opportunities for minority students in at-risk communities. The WEI model is proving to be a successful methodology for achieving outstanding enrollment, completion, and employment outcomes.

WEI funding allows colleges to remove barriers to student success, which may include free tuition, childcare, transportation, and education supplies.

### Greater Peoria Essential Abilities & Knowledge (GPEAK) –

GPEAK is a regional collaboration between Illinois Central College, the CEO Council's RWA, the Greater Peoria EDC, the Illinois Community College Board, JFF, and EdSystems. This curriculum sets the framework for essential employability skills:

**Apprenticeship Assistance** - Provides financial resources to employers of apprentices. Individuals must meet WIOA eligibility criteria. This Federally funded service helps reduce the apprentices' classroom training costs, provides wraparound services to the apprentice, and reimburses employers a percentage of the training wages.

**Incumbent Worker Training** - Incumbent Worker Training (IWT) assistance helps local employers develop and implement training programs for their existing employees to increase productivity and boost the company's competitiveness.

**On-the-Job Training** - On-the-Job Training (OJT) assistance has been designed as a way of helping businesses manage the cost of training new employees. Through OJT, employers may be reimbursed 50 to 75% of an eligible new hire's wages during a customized training period. The duration of the OJT assistance is determined by the job requirements and the individual's skills. Individuals must meet WIOA eligibility criteria. Wage requirements may apply.

### Regional Workforce Alliance —

The RWA is a Collective Impact Organization formed in response to regional employer workforce challenges. Having a capable, sustainable workforce is the number one driver of growth, this collaborative works to stabilize and grow our economy by systematically connecting employers, educators, communitybased organizations, and other stakeholders with the workforce to ensure 60% of the region's workforce has the required certifications to obtain gainful employment.

**Emerging Workforce Pillar** - Addresses student career exploration, High School Experiences & College Credits, Career Decisions, Post-Secondary Credentials, Apprenticeships, and regional undergraduate and graduate programs focused on retaining recent graduates in the Region.

**Upskilling Pillar** - Targets underemployed and under-credentialed adults with work experience and training opportunities to obtain credentials that address workforce gaps for targeted industries, a majority of which are earn-and-learn programs and generally encompass wrap-around services for the individual.

**Multiple Barriers Pillar** - Focuses on adults who swirl through Community-Based Organizations and support systems with little-to-no credentials or work experience to qualify for entry-level job stabilization.
