



- **Minority Business Development:** The Minority Business Development Center hosted grant writing classes to empower individuals, businesses, and nonprofits to secure funding opportunities.
- Women's Business Development Center: The SBA launched a Women's Business Development Center in Peoria, providing resources and support for female entrepreneurs.
- Transportation Pilot: The Racial Justice & Equity (RJE) Commission designed a transportation assistance program to provide vouchers to individuals seeking higher paying jobs that was funded by the City of Peoria.
- Public Feedback: RJE Commission hosted public forums to solicit input and feedback.
- **South Side Redevelopment:** The demolition of Harrison and McKinley schools in Peoria marks a step forward in creating new development opportunities on the city's South Side.

This report highlights this year's progress in implementing The Big Table: Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS). It showcases the collective efforts of community organizations, businesses, individuals, and governments at the local, state, and federal levels in advancing the CEDS goals, fostering collaboration, innovation, and regional growth.



- **Distillery Labs Milestone:** Opened as the first hub in the Illinois Innovation Network, serving as a catalyst for innovation and entrepreneurship.
- **Economic Development Forum:** Hosted a high-impact forum featuring renowned site selector Jay Garner, who shared insights on positioning the region for investment.
- **Global Partnerships:** Strengthened international relations by hosting delegations from Germany, Brazil, Mexico, Canada, and Australia.
- Business Outreach: Broadened and formalized the Business Retention and Expansion program to connect with more companies, address challenges, and analyze economic trends.
- ERC Fellow: LEAD and GPEDC awarded an Economic Recovery Corps Fellow to expand rural business outreach.
- Small Business Support: Twelve partners served as Community Navigators and assisted 35 small businesses in securing \$660K in COVID relief through B2B New Business grants.
- **Economic Empowerment:** The Minority Business Development Center was selected as an Economic Empowerment Center to better support minority entrepreneurs.
- Targeted Industries: Completed a Targeted Industry Analysis (funded by EDA) to shape business attraction strategies.

**GOAL 2: WORKFORCE** 

- CareerSpark Initiative: Facilitated a hands-on career experience for over 4,000 8th-grade students and the You're Hired virtual platform for over 5,000 high schoolers.
- Lincoln CareerSpark: The CareerSpark initiative expanded to Logan County in 2024 with a local program that served over 200 middle school students.
- Workforce Strategies: Utilized state funding to conduct a comprehensive Labor Shed and Workforce Development Analysis to inform workforce strategies.
- Choose Greater Peoria: Marketing efforts attracted over 3,500 leads from individuals interested in relocating to Greater Peoria. Launched Talent Concierge program.
- Energy Transition Hub: Heaven's View Community Development Corporation received a \$480K CEJA grant to serve as an Energy Transition Navigator hub.
- Housing & Employment Support: The Peoria Housing Authority secured funding to provide job training, placement, and education referrals for residents.
- Employ Central Illinois: Led by ICC, this initiative created pre-apprenticeship programs in collaboration with Peoria Public Schools, Pekin, and Illini Bluffs to support career readiness.
- Workforce Legislation Advocacy: The Community Foundation of Central Illinois and partners successfully advocated for the Workforce Development Through Charitable Loan Repayment Act.
- Community-Based Childcare: PCCEO launched a daycare center within the main bus transit center to address childcare needs for working families.

- OSF Cancer Healthcare Expansion: Opened a state-of-the-art cancer therapy center featuring cutting-edge proton beam therapy.
- Carle Health Expansion: Opened Trillium Place, a comprehensive in- and out-patient behavioral health care center serving children and adolescents.
- Substance Abuse Improvements: Logan County increased substance abuse services, including needle exchange and narcan vending
- Play in Peoria Festival: Weeklong celebration of Greater Peoria including Go Day 2024, a free celebration of the region's arts, sports, events, and dining offerings for the community.
- Public Art Enhancements: Increased public art installations across the region, featuring highlights like the Sculpture Walk and Big Picture projects.
- **Destination Commercial Series:** Discover Peoria completed a dynamic series promoting regional attractions, distributed across social and traditional media platforms.
- Broadband Development: Completed planning and feasibility studies for expanding broadband in Logan, Mason, and Tazewell Counties to improve connectivity.
- Affordable Housing Investment: City of Peoria awarded a \$1.25M HUD gran to the \$14M Churchview Garden Homes project on Peoria's south side.
- **Neighborhood Revitalization**: Peoria Housing Authority secured a planning grant for the Choice Neighborhood initiative, focusing on revitalizing Peoria's South Side.

## **GOAL 4: NATURAL RESOURCES**

- **Environmental Grant:** Tri-County Regional Planning Commission secured a U.S. EPA Brownfields Assessment grant to support environmental revitalization efforts.
- Illinois River Collaboration: The Heart of Illinois Regional Port District is fostering stronger connections among stakeholders along the Illinois River to enhance regional logistics and trade.
- **AgTech Innovation:** AgTech Connect continues its Quarterly Convenings, driving collaboration and innovation in agricultural technology.
- **iFAB Biomanufacturing Leadership:** Built connections with iFAB in Champaign-Decatur, which was awarded a \$51M EDA Tech Hubs grant, which will help propel Central Illinois to the forefront of biomanufacturing excellence.
- Carbon-Free Schools: Ameren Illinois is providing schools with free Carbon-Free Assessments to promote sustainable practices and energy efficiency.
- Placemaking Improvements: The Audubon Society constructed a new trailhead in Chillicothe; Pekin and Germantown Hills developed new multi-use paths; multiple investments in downtown infrastructure across the region.
